California State Meeting Highlights



Some Ends and some Odds emerged at the 151st State Meeting in Visalia, CA during the weekend of April 23-26. The Riverside Chapter was ably represented by Vice President Greg Barrett and Secretary Gene Justin (Friday only). Here are some highlights of the sessions.

1. Changing the guard: Randy Dhindsa is now our State President. Two other key state positions have changed hands as David Arthurs became State Registrar and Steve Andrews became State Secretary. These are two of the most demanding positions at the state level and do not change annually.
2. As mentioned on Page 1, chapters are being asked to adopt chapter flags to promote their local identity.
3. After extensive discussion, attendees voted to amend the SAR Recessional to recognize the contributions of women by revising the final words to read "... a nation of free men and women". This affirmative vote does not comply with the State By-Laws.
4. A proposal to create positions of Chaplain North and Chaplain South was sidelined due to a By-Law conflict. Therefore, the proposal was revised for one to assist the other.
5. The State Genealogist reported that review time at the National level has significantly improved over the past year. (This is confirmed by review times for new member Riverside Chapter applications. Supplemental reviews still languish).
6. State President Ferris encouraged Chapters to be active in Eagle Scout and ROTC/JROTC events; and to collaborate with VFW, and American Legion groups, as a strategy to boost membership.

**NSSAR Announces Reduced Application Fees
During Month of July 2026**



The NSSAR Registrar General has announced that in celebration of the 250th Anniversary of the Signing of the Declaration of Independence, the National Society will offer a reduced registration fee for New Member and Jr. Member applications during the month of July 2026.

For applications postmarked between July 1 and July 31, 2026, the National application fee for New Applications will be reduced from \$150 to \$76 in honor of the year 1776. The \$50 Annual Dues fee remains in place, so the NSSAR fee will be \$126 instead of \$200.

This special fee applies **only to New Member and Jr. Member** (New Lineage) Applications submitted during the July 2026 window.

The special fee does not apply to Family Plan Applications, Memorial Applications, or Supplemental Applications

To qualify for the reduced fee, New of Junior Applications must be started in May or early June in order to be received by the State Registrar during the last week of June. State-approved applications will then be forwarded to the National Society postmarked between **July 1 and July 31, 2026**. Due to the high number of application submissions when reduced rates are in effect, an early July submission will save weeks in processing.

250TH Minute

Banastre Tarleton wins the Battle of the Waxhaws

On this day in history, May 29, 1780, Banastre Tarleton wins the Battle of the Waxhaws. After British forces had captured Charleston, SC on May 12, 1780, Lt. Gen. Charles Cornwallis quickly took a large army to conquer the backcountry.

Cornwallis learned that John Rutledge, South Carolina's rebel governor was fleeing to the north with 400 Virginia Continentals under Col. Abraham Buford. Cornwallis could not move his army fast enough to catch Rutledge, so he sent Lt. Col. Banastre Tarleton ahead with around 270 men to capture Rutledge.

Upon reaching Buford's rear guard, Tarleton sent a negotiator demanding Buford's surrender. Buford had learned of Tarleton's approach and sent Rutledge ahead to safety. When the surrender demand was delivered, Buford replied with a terse, "Sir, I reject your proposals, and shall defend myself to the last extremity." When Tarleton received the reply, he quickly put together an attack and charged the patriots.

As Tarleton's dragoons (cavalry) charged the American line, Buford's defense plan proved to be a disastrous as the dragoons were barely phased as they trounced through the American line, causing numerous injuries and causing them to scatter in every direction. Many of the Americans laid down their weapons and attempted to surrender.

What happened next is unclear due to differing reports by those involved. Tarleton's horse was shot from under him and he fell to the ground. The British soldiers thought Tarleton was dead and began to attack the wounded and captured Americans without impunity, killing them with bayonets where they lay.

In the end, 113 Americans were dead and 150 wounded. The British had only 5 killed and 12 wounded. The Battle of the Waxhaws, where the battle took place, was called the Waxhaw Massacre or Buford's Massacre, and earned Tarleton an infamous reputation. He was accused of ordering his soldiers to kill the captured Americans and giving them no quarter. The perceived atrocity led to a huge increase in volunteers to the patriot militia. In reality, Tarleton's men were probably to blame for killing the wounded after thinking their commander had been killed.

Tarleton's reputation as a villain even occurs in today's popular culture. In the 2000 movie, *The Patriot*, the villain, Colonel Tavington, is loosely based on Tarleton. Tavington is portrayed as a bloodthirsty killer, burning civilians in churches and murdering children in front of their parents. In reality, Tarleton could be vulgar, but this is an extreme misrepresentation of who he was.

Mission Statement
